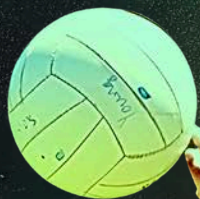

# FORMAT & RULES

## UNDER-14 AND UNDER-17 TOURNAMENT FORMAT

- Seven players a side; squads of up to 14.
- 10 minutes a half for all games.
- Round robin format with each team playing three group games on the Saturday.
- 2 points are awarded for a group game win.
- 1 point is awarded for a group game draw.
- 0 points for a group game loss.
- The top two teams in the group progress to the final on Sunday.
- If teams finish with equal points in the group stage, the tie will be decided by the following means in the order specified:
  - Scoring difference (subtracting the scores against from the scores for).
  - Highest total score for.
  - Where only two teams are involved – the outcome of the previous meeting of the two teams in the competition.
  - Scoring average – divide total score against into total scores for.

## UNDER-14 AND UNDER-17 PLAYING RULES

- Play commences with a throw-in between two players from each team in the middle of the field.
- Goalkeeper may advance to the 10m line for a kick-out.
- The side-to-side shoulder challenge is permitted in boys football only. No intentional contact is allowed in girls football.
- Tackling – the ball can be knocked away when the player solos or bounces the ball.
- The ball may be caught in the hands and played away by kicking it or striking it with the fist or open hand.
- The ball may be carried four steps before bouncing or toe-tapping it. The ball may be lifted off the ground with the hands in all grades provided the player is on their feet.
- Freekicks may be taken from the hand or off the ground.
- Penalties are awarded where the attacking player is fouled inside the box.
- The player who is fouled takes the free and when an opponent fouls the ball, the closest opposition player takes the free.
- The opponent nearest to where the ball crosses the line takes the sideline kick from the hands.
- When the defender plays the ball over his/her own end line, the other team are awarded a freekick from the centre of the field opposite where the ball crossed the line.
- Opposing players to be at least 5m from the freekick taker, sideline kick or kick-out.
- Freekicks should be no closer than 10m from the opposing end line.
- Unlimited interchanges are allowed.

# FORMAT & RULES

## UNDER-10 AND UNDER-12 TOURNAMENT FORMAT

All games played on the Saturday.

Seven players a side; squads of up to 14.

10 minutes a half for all games.

## UNDER-10 AND UNDER-12 PLAYING RULES

- Play commences with a kick-out from the hands.
- Goalkeeper may advance up to the 10m square line.
- The ball may be caught in the hands and played away by kicking it or striking it with the fist or hand.
- The ball may be carried four steps before bouncing or toe-tapping it, a maximum of one bounce and one toe tap/solo per possession.
- The ball may be lifted off the ground with the hands, provided the player is on their feet.
- Tackling – the ball can be knocked away when the player is soloing or bouncing the ball.
- The player who is fouled takes the free and when an opponent fouls the ball, the closest opposition player takes the free.
- The opponent nearest to where the ball crosses the line takes the sideline kick from the hands.
- When the defender plays the ball over his/her own end line, the other team are awarded a freekick from the halfway line.
- Opposing players to be at least 5m from the freekick taker, sideline kick or kick-out
- Freekicks should be no closer than 10m from the opposing end line.
- Unlimited interchanges allowed and coaches should ensure equal playing time.

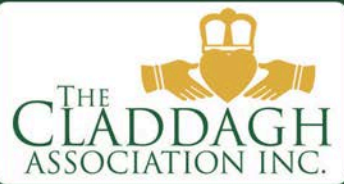

# YOUTH GAELIC GAMES IN AUSTRALASIA

---

Youth Gaelic games in Australasia are thriving, with a vibrant community of young players across Australia and New Zealand. Youth development has been a feature of the Gaelic games landscape for decades. From 1978 to 2018, the boys' minor (under-18) Australasia Championships showcased our up-and-coming talent, with teams from Victoria, South Australia, Auckland, Queensland, and Western Australia competing regularly.

The past two decades have seen significant growth in youth games, especially for the younger age groups. In 2012, the Gaelic Games Junior Academy of Western Australia was established, marking an important development for the region. This academy, for children aged four to 12, became a model for other states and clubs, including Na Fianna Catalpa Youths in WA, South Australia, New South Wales, Geelong Gaels, Peninsula Harps, Naarm Gaels, Young Melbourne in Victoria, Brisbane Youths in Queensland, and teams across New Zealand each now have popular youth programmes of their own.

In 2019, the WA junior academy made history as the first Australasian team to compete at Féile Peille na nÓg in Ireland, reaching the semi-finals of the tournament. This achievement highlighted the growth of youth Gaelic games in Australasia and inspired a new generation of players.

Following a delay due to COVID, 2023 saw the inaugural Australasia Féile held in Adelaide, featuring teams from South Australia, WA, and Victoria. Many participants went on to form the Australasia team that competed at the 2024 Féile in Mayo, marking the first Australasia-wide team represented in Ireland.

In 2024, Tom Murphy of WA was appointed as Youth Officer of Australasia Gaelic Games, and the region also trained 15 new coach developers to further enhance youth development. With numbers increasing year on year, and new pathways and tournaments being developed, the future bodes well for youth Gaelic games in Australasia.
